Here comes the bride!

The month of August sees the return of weddings to our churches – and what a joy this will be as we celebrate with various couples, their families and friends. However, even though a wedding can go ahead, as you can imagine there are some differences – we can't have the bells ringing, there will be no singing and a total of 30 people including myself and the photographer!

This is, of course, a sign that some parts of our life together are beginning to return to something new. We have been able to open our church doors too for Sunday worship and private prayer (see details for this elsewhere). However, over recent months there have been plenty of events and occasions that have had to be adapted or postponed. Instead of gathering in church for funerals it has been a comfort for grieving families to see friends from the villages standing outside to pay their respects as the cortege has driven by. Our local schools have been hugely creative to give their Yr6 pupils the celebration they deserve as they leave school. I wonder how you have felt at such times and when other celebrations such as birthdays have had to be different to usual. These occasions and other rites of passage are important for us all.

And one thing that has been clear throughout recent months in our villages is how good we are at helping each other and pulling together. It's always good to remember that – and to say quite simply, thank you!

VJ Day - 15th August

The 15th August is VJ Day – Victory in Japan. As Captain, now Colonel Sir Tom Wood reminded us earlier this year, the second World War did not end in May 1945. Although fighting ceased in Europe, there was still 'the forgotten army' in the Far East. The Japanese Armed Forces had captured nearly 140,000 allied military personnel from Australia,



Canada, Great Britain, India, the Netherlands, New Zealand and the USA. For those suffering in Japanese prisoner of war camps and the loved ones they had left behind, the war did not end until the announcement on 15th August 1945 that Japan had surrendered.

My father, Norman Huston, with the rest of the 9th Battalion of the Royal Northumberland Fusiliers had been shipped to the Far East. They were all taken prisoner on 15th February1942, only 17 days after landing in Singapore and they were prisoners for the next three and a half years, working as slave labour including on the infamous Burma Railway. Japan had not signed up to the Geneva Convention, the treatment of prisoners was brutal and over 30,000 died from starvation, disease & cruelty. My father survived and like many others rarely spoke of his experiences.

It is only recently, during 'lockdown' that I have engaged with a Facebook group called 'FEPOW (Far East Prisoners of War) Keep the Candle Burning'.

I discovered there is 'a Roll of Honour'. There was a page for my Dad with his name & very little other information on it. Now, with an enormous amount of help from Ronnie Taylor (the group founder & administrator, whose father was also a FEPOW) I have managed to complete a full entry in Dad's memory.

While I do not want to dwell on the undoubted horrors of that time, if anyone wants to know more about a relative who was a prisoner in Japan, I recommend this FEPOW Group.

The British Legion and the National Memorial Arboretum will be remembering & commemorating those who died in the camps on the 75th anniversary of VJ Day.

Walk Church—Alex Bienfait

Once a month for the past nine months (pre coronavirus outbreak), a group from the Diocese of Canterbury (Biddenden & Smarden) has experimented with taking church outdoors. This is a congregation that meets at a church but then goes out to experience God by walking in the countryside: kind of ramblers' church, this is Walk Church.



Walks can take between 90 minutes and two hours and involve stops to hear the day's Gospel reading, offer reflections, pray and share our responses. There may be a period of walking in silence while we pay attention to what we see and hear around us. There is also plenty of fellowship and chat. Someone usually brings some cake which we share as we stand by a path or sit under a tree, an informal communion.

Churches are often served by good networks of footpaths, a reminder of their once central position in rural communities. With our walks, we create a community of faith as we journey together, tell stories, share food, listen to the Bible and pray. We never really know how things will go. There might be a wonderful offering of food on a cold winter's day, or we may have random incidents which we can't predict, such as the person who trod on an upturned horseshoe (fortunately with no serious injury). Each meeting is a pilgrimage and an adventure.

Part of the purpose of Walk Church is to train ourselves to keep our senses open to the what there is to be seen and experienced around us – a bee swarm, the tragic remains of a run-over grass snake, a biting, piercing wind. With different people and different paths each time, Walk Church is a community that keeps remaking itself. Right from its inception, Walk Church has demonstrated an appeal across the generations with families, young people and dogs invariably part of the group.

The inspiration for Walk Church is twofold. First, there is the growing popularity of communal walking, with burgeoning numbers of organised health walks and rambling groups. We wanted to explore whether there were people who were uninspired by the experience of sitting in a pew but who still wanted to explore questions of faith and pray together with others in a more open, less formal setting. In fact, most sessions of Walk Church have attracted a mix of committed churchgoers and people who are not part of any other congregation.

Secondly, Walk Church is also about working out how faith can help us better value our natural world. Indoors, we have struggled to make the environment a theme that is exciting for our worship, but being outdoors will hopefully excite our imagination and passion. We may appreciate in our heads that there is a looming environmental crisis but how can we respond if we don't have passion?



Pegwell Bay Country Park

Nestled on the east coast of Kent, Pegwell Bay Country Park commands stunning views of Sandwich and Deal to the west and the cliffs of Ramsgate to the east. With a play area, picnic spot and mobile refreshments on top, it is a great destination for a family day out.

The park acts as the entrance to a nature reserve and the rare flora and fauna here make this an area of national importance. This stretch of windswept coastline includes chalk cliffs, mud flats, saltmarsh and sand dunes, and is an important habitat for bird species.



The Nature Reserve

The Nature Reserve is a Ramsar Site of International Importance and is a wonderful place to explore with lots to see at different times of the year. In the summer the grass is dotted with wild flowers such as orchids and broomrapes. In the winter the foreshore and mudflats attract thousands of wading birds, including dunlin, sanderling and grey plover. Birds of prey, such as Merlin, can also be seen at the site. Birdwatchers can use the public bird hide, which is also accessible for disabled visitors.

Sandwich and Pegwell Bay is home to spectacular bird life that is designated as a protected area under UK and EU legislation and is also considered a world class wetland.

However, people can easily disturb birds and prevent them feeding, resting or breeding. Authorities and local people need to work together to make sure the area continues to be a haven for the world's birds.

A brief history of Pegwell Bay Country Park

Pegwell Bay was a popular destination for Victorian holiday-makers, fossil hunters and rock poolers. In the 19th Century, a pleasure pier was built to establish a seaside resort to rival nearby Ramsgate. This was not a success, however, and it was dismantled before the end of the century.

The park is on a former landfill site. After the site closed, the area was capped and landscaped and was re-opened as a picnic site by Kent County Council in 1983.

Recipe

Blackberry Sorbet:

Ingredients: 250g caster sugar, 400g blackberries, juice of ½ lemon

Method:

1. Put the sugar in a pan with 250ml water and bring to a simmer, stirring occasionally, until all the sugar has dissolved. Set aside to cool completely.

2. Put the blackberries and lemon juice in a small food processor or blender and whizz to a purée (or whizz with a stick blender in a jug), then push through a fine sieve into a mixing bowl using the back of a spoon (discard the seeds). Add the cooled syrup and mix until combined. Churn in an ice cream machine until smooth; freeze overnight until solid.

Wildlife Watch

The average lifespan of dragonflies (and their close cousins, damselflies) is around 2 years. Most of this time is spent as a nymph, in water. In ponds and rivers all over the world, these nymphs are vicious predators, tackling prey up to their own size! After two years underwater, when conditions are right, the nymph will clamber up a reed, where it begins its transformation into an adult.

Though showing a preference, dragonflies are strong fliers, and can be seen at some distance from suitable bodies of water. Most sightings however, are near bodies of water. A walk down the canal or river, around a pond or lake, will almost certainly guarantee sightings.

Despite the reputation and stories they will not bite, nor sting and should you be lucky enough to have one land on you, don't be scared, be honoured that one has chose you to rest on.



Draft Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Approved Minutes of the Virtual Parish Council Meeting held via Zoom, on Tuesday 16th June 2020 at 7.30pm.

Present: Councillors G. Bryant (Chairman), L. Ageros, G. North, L. Fallon, D. Divers Also, Present: Sara Archer – Clerk, District ClIrs R. Pugh & Trevor Roper plus 2 members of the public.

14/20-21 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Apologies had been received from District Cllr David Hart and County Cllr Liz Hurst.

15/20-21 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr Bryant declared an interest regarding planning application TCA/TH/20/0635 and would not be taking part in any discussions. No other interests were declared.

16/20-21 PREVIOUS MINUTES

RESOLVED: To approve the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 19th May 2020. These were proposed by ClIr Fallon, seconded by ClIr North, all present agreed and therefore the minutes would be signed by the Chairman as a correct record when able.

17/20-21 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Cllr Bryant read his report as follows:

You will be pleased to hear that I have not got too much to report this month. Due to the lockdown, progress in many areas has been slow. I rang David Ogilvie Engineering about the memorial bench and could only leave a message. They have not got back to me yet.

Any rumours that you may have heard about moving the multi use games area in Bell Meadow are false. Any proposal such as this would have to be put before this Council for consideration. If any other Councillor knows anything about this perhaps, they will enlighten us. I am aware that Sunningdale Developments are proposing to put a gate in the fence between the boundary of Orchard Close and Bell Meadow, but they have not approached us about a pathway.

The Mars bars were purchased and handed over to The Waste Management Team at TDC. They were well received. I am aware of some negativity against the bin collectors throughout Thanet and therefore I hope that this small gesture has gone some way to improve morale.

I was contacted by a resident regarding issues in Bridges Close and the overgrown pavement/alleyway from Bridges Close and The Street. Thanet Housing Association have been contacted and I think that it is beginning to get tidied up. (addendum: I have asked Martin if he and/or James can do a clean-up around there).

Finally my thanks to all of you that have continued with the litter picking and general clearing up around the villages. I am most grateful to everyone involved in this.

18/20-21 CLERK'S REPORT/CORRESPONDENCE

The Clerk reported that a resident had been in contact regarding an unsafe tree at Bell Meadow. The handyman had examined the tree and confirmed it would need to be removed by a qualified tree surgeon. Quotes would be obtained and brought to the next meeting. (addendum: Cllr Bryant obtained three quotes which were circulated to the Parish Councillors, the work was deemed to be urgent and therefore it was agreed to instruct Westgate Tree Services to carry out the work immediately).

The Clerk advised she had met with the internal auditor, the forms would be signed and completed accordingly.

Cllr Hurst had queried whether the Parish Council would like a public stand alone sanitizer and would offer funding towards the costs should the Parish Council like to install one. Councillors considered the suggestion and agreed it was not necessary at the moment.

Concern regarding the road safety at Potten Street Road/Potten Street junction caused by inconsiderate parking was discussed. It was suggested the PCSO was contacted to advise the resident of the issues.

19/20-21 THANET DISTRICT COUNCIL COUNCILLORS' REPORT

Cllr Pugh advised that missed waste collections have been due to a reduced number of operatives working in order to adhere to social distancing measures, and an increase in waste being produced. Residents were encouraged to leave the bins out and they would be collected as soon as it is possible.

Some public toilet facilities have been opened at the local beaches and the business grant scheme has been well received throughout the District.

The District Council have launched a High Street Fund, £138k has been allocated to assist the High Streets and reopen businesses primarily in Margate, Ramsgate and Broadstairs.

Cllr Roper added that portaloos are being put at Margate beach along with extra security officers to help alleviate the issues caused by the number of visitors to the area, and the RNLI are providing more lifesavers on the busiest beaches.

The refuse tips are reopened on an appointment only basis via KCC.

Refuse vehicles are being replaced next April, to be narrower to enable greater access to the more restrictive roads, at a cost of approximately £225k each.

20/20-21 KENT COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Cllr Liz Hurst was not present and no report provided.

21/20-21 PLANNING APPLICATIONS

a) Council considered the following applications:

TCA/TH/20/0635 - 2 Rose Cottages, The Length, St Nicholas At Wade

1No Holly - 5m to be taken off the top (crowned) and spread of the tree to be reduced to 160cm in diameter

Agreed to refer to the Tree Officer

FH/TH/20/0670 - 6 Downbarton Farm Cottages, Down Barton Road, St Nicholas Erection of a two storey side extension following demolition of existing extensions Plans did not appear available online for this particular application. Clarification would be sought from TDC before comments being made.

F/TH/20/0668 - Huckleberry Farm, Down Barton Road, St Nicholas

Erection of 1No three bedroom dwelling for accommodation for glamping site manager Application circulated, concern that the archaeological digs had not been carried out. Objections raised.

It was suggested that Cllr Hart was invited to attend a meeting of the Chairs of the Parish Councils to answer queries regarding planning issues in particular.

It is expected the Local Plan will be approved at a full council meeting on 9th July.

b) None received.

22/20-21 FINANCE

(a) The Clerk presented the monthly bank reconciliation between the cash book and bank accounts. This had been sent to ClIr Radclyffe for inspection prior to the meeting.

RESOLVED: To approve the monthly bank reconciliation for May. (Proposed: Cllr Radclyffe following the meeting).

(b) The Clerk presented the monthly payment schedule which included the following invoices:

RESOLVED: To approve payment of invoices included in the monthly payment schedule for June (Proposed: Cllr Bryant, Seconded: Cllr North)

(c) The purchase of a sign for the cemetery to advise of appropriate conduct, was discussed. The Clerk made enquiries for wording with other local cemeteries. Wording to be confirmed and quotes to be obtained.

(d) Cllr Fallon presented the quotes for the remarking of the parking bays at Bell Meadow. Discussion took place regarding the quantity of bays and provision of a disabled bay. Cross hatching would be included next to the Pavilion to improve access for buggy's and wheelchairs. It was recommended to appoint Hi-Way Services, KCC contractor, to carry out the works.

RESOLVED: To approve the appointment of Hi-Way Services to complete the work subject to the inclusion of cross hatching as discussed (Proposed: Cllr Fallon Seconded: Cllr Divers)

(e) The proposal to donate monies originally set aside for the church wall repairs, and reallocate them for new entrance gates was discussed. Inclusion on the working party to consider the design of the gates was suggested. It was considered not to be necessary to continue to reserve monies solely for the church wall.

RESOLVED: To donate the sum of £5000 to the Friends of the Church for the sole purpose of installing a new gate to the entrance of the Church, subject to the inclusion of a Parish Councillor on the working party giving consideration to the plans. (Proposed: Cllr Divers, Seconded: Cllr North) (f) The Cemetery charges for 2020/21 were reviewed, it was agreed to increase the current charges by approximately 25%.

RESOLVED: To approve the proposed increase in Cemetery Charges for 2020/21. (Proposed: Cllr Bryant, Seconded: Cllr Fallon)

(g) The Asset Register 2020/21 had been circulated. It was suggested a review was carried out to ensure everything was included. Cllr Fallon volunteered to complete with the Clerk and bring to the next meeting for approval.

23/20-21 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

- Clarification was sought regarding the involvement of the Friends of the Church to take on the installation of the new gates as both the church wall and gates are the responsibility of the Parish Council. It was considered their involvement would be beneficial to the project and was felt public consultation was not necessary in this instance.

It was advised the small church wall was unsafe and in need of repair. A structural engineers report would be considered as appropriate.

- It was suggested that planning issues being discussed should take a more professional approach.

The meeting was concluded by The Chairman at 8:45pm.
